H1N1 (swine) Flu Vaccine is still available

Health Officials say that H1N1 (swine) flu is still circulating in our communities and people who have chronic medical conditions are especially at risk for developing serious complications from the disease. The Coconino County Health Department (CCHD) is encouraging those who have not already been vaccinated against the flu to do so.

“It is not too late to get immunized against the flu. There is plenty of H1N1 (swine) flu vaccine available. If you haven’t gotten your flu shot and would like to protect yourself from getting the flu, contact your doctor or call the Health Department,” said Barbara Worgess, CCHD Director.

CCHD Clinics are scheduled as follows:

- **Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays**, (excluding Holidays), 9:00 am – 4:30 pm, Coconino County Health Department, 2625 N. King Street, **Flagstaff**
- **Saturday, Feb. 13**, 9:00 am – 1:00 pm Coconino High School, 2801 N. Izabel, **Flagstaff**

Appointments are recommended and are available by calling the CCHD Flu Information Line at 928-679-7300, toll-free at 1-877-679-7272. Walk-ins will be accepted as time permits.

There is no out-of-pocket cost for H1N1 (swine) flu vaccinations. Please bring your Medicare, AHCCCS, or insurance card if you are covered. Those at risk for complications of H1N1 (swine) flu are strongly encouraged to get the H1N1 (swine) flu vaccine.

As a reminder, children under age 10 need a second dose of H1N1 (swine) flu vaccine at least 28 days after the first dose.
