Administrative Order No. 2017-09 of the Superior Court in Coconino County established a countywide security and emergency preparedness committee (SEPC) consisting of a representative cross-section of each local SEPC in the County with each local court within the county being represented on the committee.

The Administrative Office of the Courts has grant funding for court security improvements, as outlined in the Court Security Standards adopted by Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2017-15. Courts wishing to receive grant funding must submit their completed application along with the most current court security assessment to the AOC.

**WHEREAS;** The grant application requires the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court's approval.

**THEREFORE;** pursuant to Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2017-79 and Administrative Rule V-A,

**IT IS ORDERED;** that all courts in Coconino County wishing to submit an application to the Presiding Judge for approval must first submit the application to the local County SEPC. The SEPC will review, prioritize and make a recommendation to the Presiding Judge. Any application that is not submitted through the SEPC, the Presiding Judge will forward the application to the SEPC. All courts in Coconino County shall comply with this procedure.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED;** that if the SEPC does not have a scheduled committee meeting prior to the due date of the funding application, the Court applying for the funds must contact the Chair of the SEPC.
