Feels there should be a reduction in fees since the amenity is not available and hopes that fees at the amphitheater will not increase. Stated that "high dollar" prices restrict attendees from going to concerts. Concerned about the facility fees, parking, etc. Indicated that 2/3 of Pickin' attendees are from outside of Flagstaff. Would like to provide shower trailers for festival campers, but the existing infrastructure will not allow for this. Would like to see showers in campground and improved infrastructure.	Staff noted that no fees are being proposed to increase for the amphitheater. The cost for a non-ticketed/private rentals i.e. weddings is being proposed to decrease from \$2,500 for the first 8 hours to \$600.

3/14/13	Fairgrounds Enthusiast Show	FKC Dog Show, Liz & Gary Tallman	Public Meeting: Does the vendor permit charge stay the same? Is there a park impact fee? Is the carnival lot included in the fairgrounds rental? How would the dollar-per-person fee charged - per person, per participant or registrant? When one person has several entries, how is the fee calculated? There is a fee to remove the bleachers from the fairgrounds and since we don't use them, it seems illogical. Will deposits still be charged? What are the times for the ramada rentals? Can the rates be prorated by the hour? The Home Economics and Youth building used to be one price, they would like to see that again.	The vendor fees have stayed the same. We have removed the park impact fee. The carnival lot has been separated from the fairgrounds – currently it is included in rental of the fairgrounds. The dollar-per-person fee would be charged based on how the event charges its participants. In other words, it would come from admission, entry or registration fees. Deposits will still be charged for facility rentals and will stay the same, which is half of the standard/base rental rate. Ramadas being rented for private use would not be subject to a deposit. Staff is not proposing prorating the times on the ramada. Staff intends to take into consideration the removal/relocation of bleachers as well as the rental rate for the Home Economics/Youth building.

Instead, they would prefer to leave the shavings in the stalls and just remove the manure.</p> <p>Phone: I think it is very important to have a group discount for camping. The discount helps to offset the cost for the dumpsters and portos. If you are not using the whole trail, can there be a discounted rate? The \$1 fee per horse or person can be easily passed onto their attendees. The increase in fees and the money made from the renters should come back to the park for improvements. Will there ever be showers in the campground?</p>	<p>We are not proposing to waive the application fee for long-term renters as the fee covers the direct costs associated with reviewing and processing the application. This cost is not included the facility rental fee. The proposed \$1 participant fee is charged per paid participant, not those that do not pay an admission, entry or registration fee. Each Facility Renter is expected to manage their event and put restrictions on their attendees as the determine necessary. Even if the department is not in fire restrictions, a no smoking or campfire rule is certainly one the renter can impose on their attendees. The</p>

CCPR policies and procedures currently do not provide much flexibility for waiving fees, but staff is happy to speak with you about options. For events, insurance is required. For private use, insurance is not required in most situations due to recreational immunity. 4H participants are an integral part of the Fair and we don't charge them for bringing their animal.

How is the \$1 fee charged?</p> <p>Comment Form: There are concerns on the impact on the Pine Country Classic, a team roping event that has been held over Labor Day Weekend for over 20 years: - Increase in facility cost - Park having adequate and enough facilities, services and equipment for the event -The loss of a blanket fee for Group Camping in the Stables. USTRC historically has paid the blanket fee to give our participants somewhere to camp. USTRC does not need all the stalls for the event so the proposed fee for the entire stable area does not appear to be a viable option. - Condition of the stalls continuing to deteriorate and there is no mention of plans for improvements. -Increase cost to the Pine Country Classic team roping produced by USTRC and the increased costs to other equestrian events utilizing the Posse Arena and the Stable area. This leads to concern regarding the further decline of equestrian events using the park. -One positive change is charging a dollar per participant of an event that has entrants. This structure will give the Park some revenue in years that the USTRC event may lose money. It takes 1,200 volunteer hours, donations and sponsorships to produce the Derby. Some items of concern are: having to rent more facilities (track), the \$1 fee is reasonable, but we will have to pass it along to guests. The \$1 fee will increase our typical settlement with the County three fold. The increase revenue is not specifically identified for park improvements.
