Only voters with a registered party of Democratic are eligible to vote in the Presidential Preference Election. If you wish to change your party in order to vote in this election, you must update your registration no later than **Tuesday, February 18, 2020.**

If you are listed as a Permanent Early Voter, you will automatically receive a ballot by mail approximately three weeks before each election in which you are eligible to vote. If you wish to be removed from the Permanent Early Voter List, or to cancel mailing of early ballots for one or more elections, please contact the Recorder's Office.

If you are NOT a Permanent Early Voter, you will receive a sample ballot before each election notifying you where you may vote for that election.

You must update your voter registration whenever you change your residence address, name, or political party preference. Election mail is not forwardable. It is important to keep your mailing address current with our office, even if you are only temporarily away.

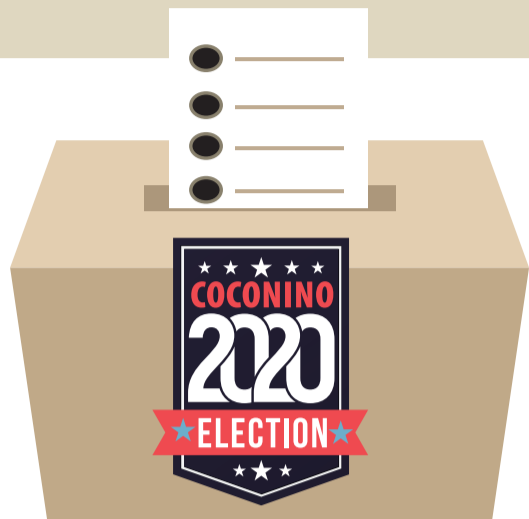

Presidential Preference Election (PPE)

The Democratic Party is the only party participating in the PPE this year. All other voters, including those registered as Republican, Libertarian, Green, Independent, or those who are unaffiliated, are not eligible. If you wish to change your party in order to participate in this election, you must update your registration no later than **Tuesday, February 18.**



Polling Place Voters

Your assigned polling place may be different for the Presidential Preference Election than for the state Primary and General elections. Additionally, in some precincts the PPE will be conducted as a ballot-by-mail election. You will receive a sample ballot or postcard notifying you of your voting options before each election.

Election Day polling place hours: 6 a.m. - 7p.m.

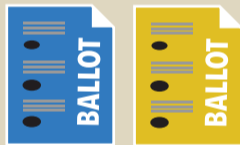


Make the Primary Election A Primary Concern ★ **August 4, 2020**

All registered voters are eligible to vote in the state Primary Election.

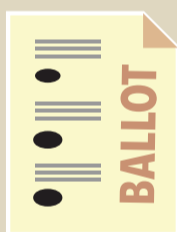
Voters registered with a recognized political party may only vote that party's ballot.

YOU VOTE YOUR PARTY'S BALLOT

Voters who are not registered with a recognized political party, **including those registered as Independent**, may choose one party ballot to vote.

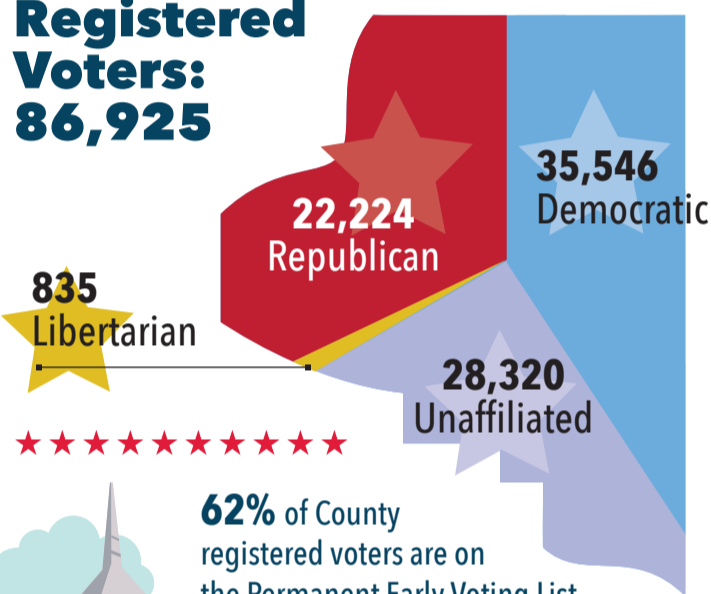


YOU CHOOSE YOUR BALLOT

Voters who are on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL) and are not registered with a recognized political party must let the Recorder's Office know which ballot they want to receive. **If a ballot is not specified, then one will not be mailed.**

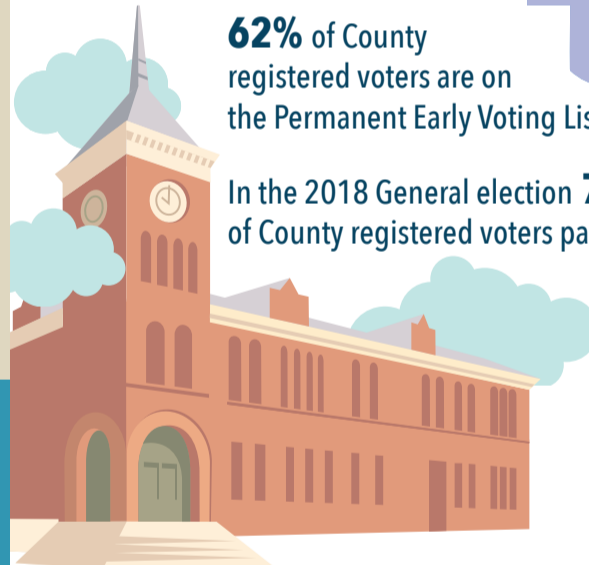
The best method of specifying a ballot is to return the yellow form mailed out to you 90 days prior to the election.

Coconino County Registered Voters: 86,925



62% of County registered voters are on the Permanent Early Voting List.

In the 2018 General election **74%** of County registered voters participated.

EARLY VOTING OPTIONS

Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL)

Any registered voter with a mailing address within Arizona may request to be placed on the Permanent Early Voter List (PEVL). **Voters on the PEVL will automatically receive an early ballot by mail for all elections in which they are eligible to participate.**

There is an option to sign up for the PEVL on the Arizona voter registration form.

Request an Early Ballot

Voters who are not on the Permanent Early Voting List may request an early ballot to be mailed to them up to 11 days before an election.

An early ballot can be requested through our website, by phone, or in writing.

Vote Early In Person

Voters may vote early in person up until the Friday before an election.

Early voting is available at the Coconino County Recorder's Office as well as several other sites within the county. Please call for more information or visit our website for a complete list of early voting sites.
