Patrol

- *Around 77,000 calls for service*
- *4,590 departmental reports*
- *Trends indicate increases in calls for service:*
 - *Mental Health Emergencies (mental health crisis, suicidal)*
 - *Death Investigations*
 - *Drugs*
 - *Civil Matter*
 - *Person Crimes (DV, Threatening / Intimidating and Sexual Assaults)*
 - *Property Crimes (Littering, Trespass, Auto Thefts)*
 - *Traffic Complaints*
 - *Motorist Assists*
 - *Technical Search and Rescue (doubled since 2012)*

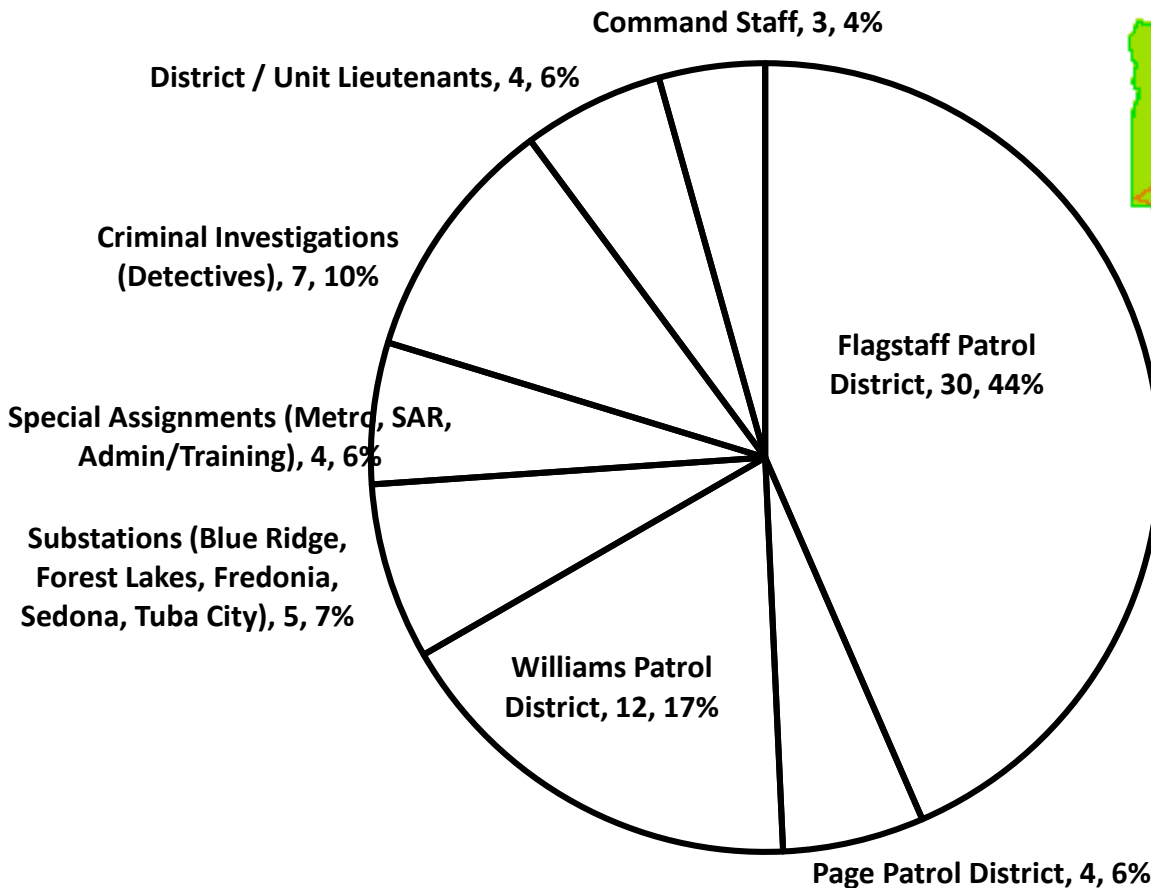
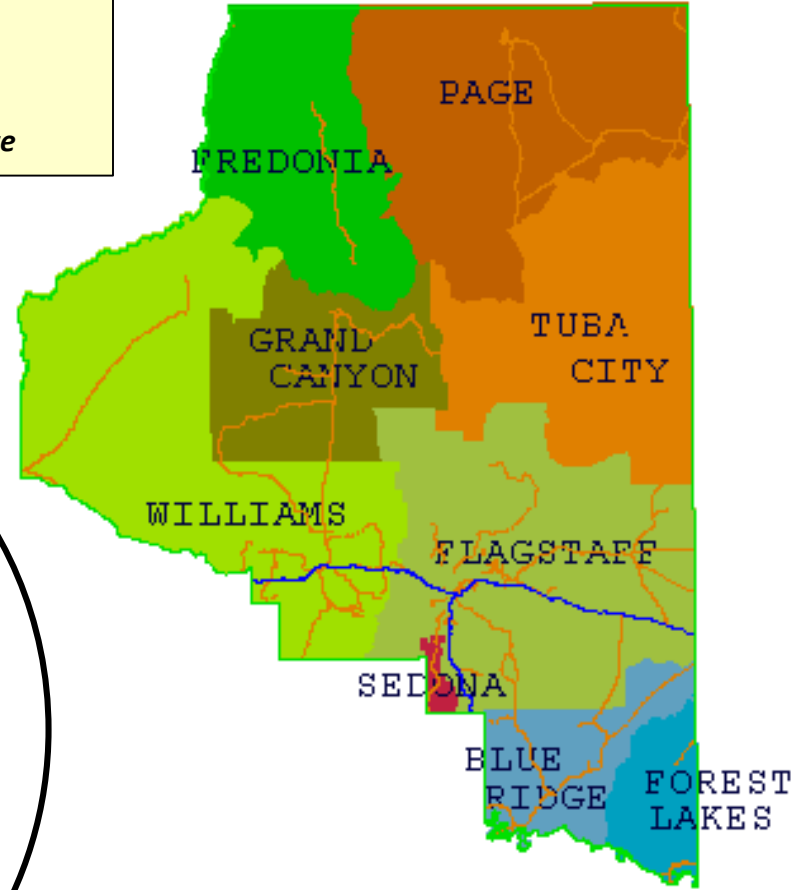

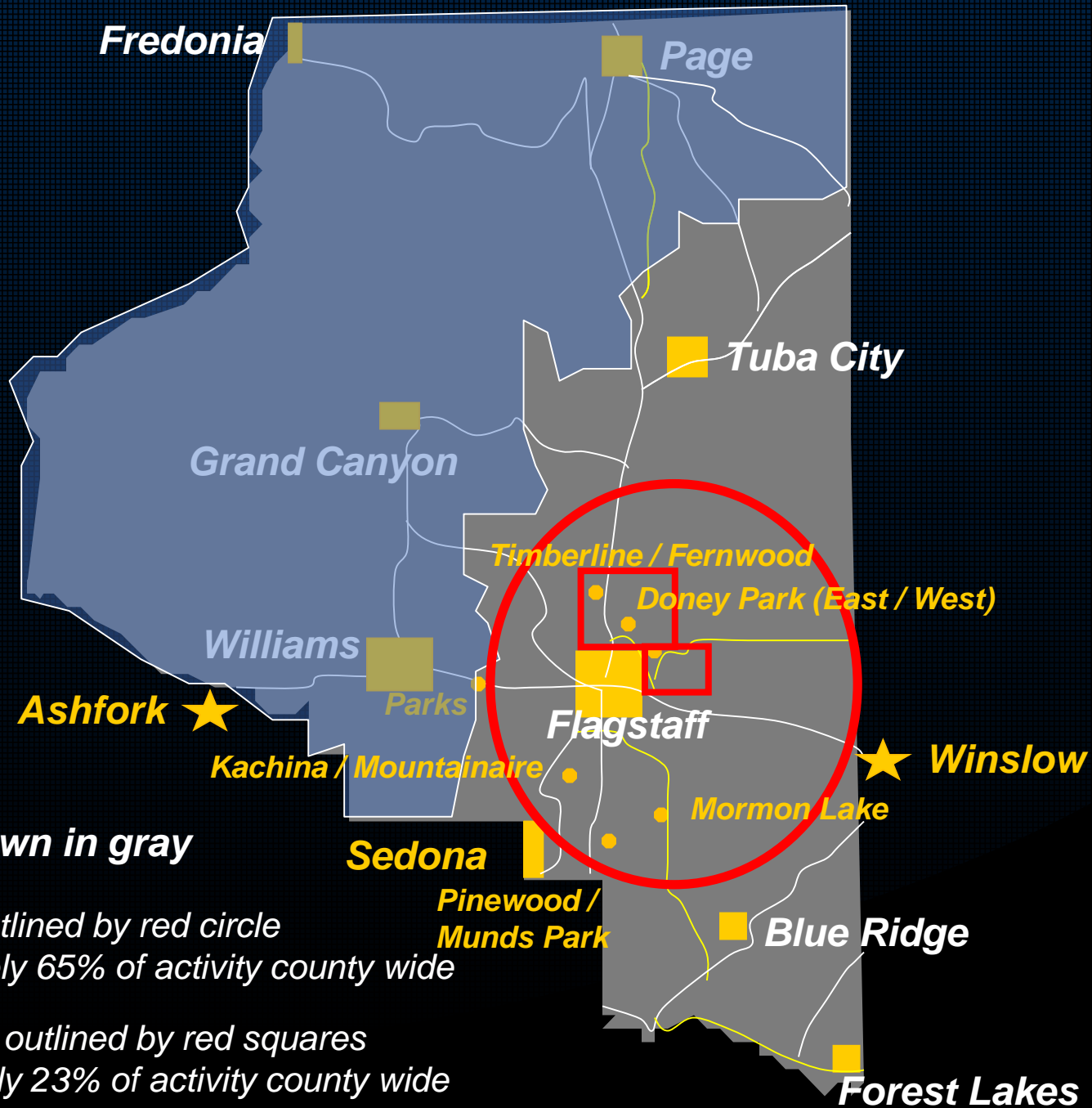

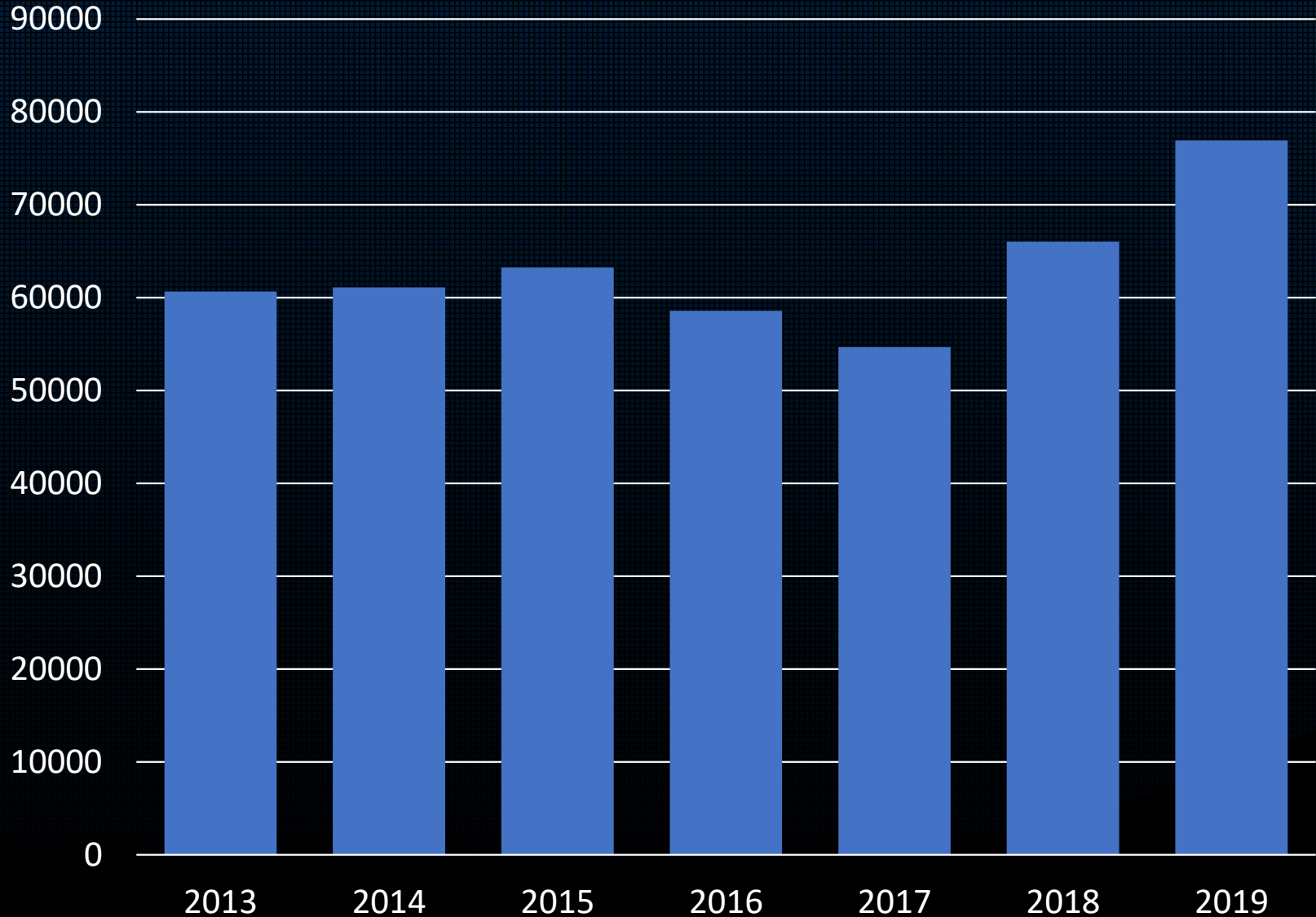


Flagstaff District shown in gray

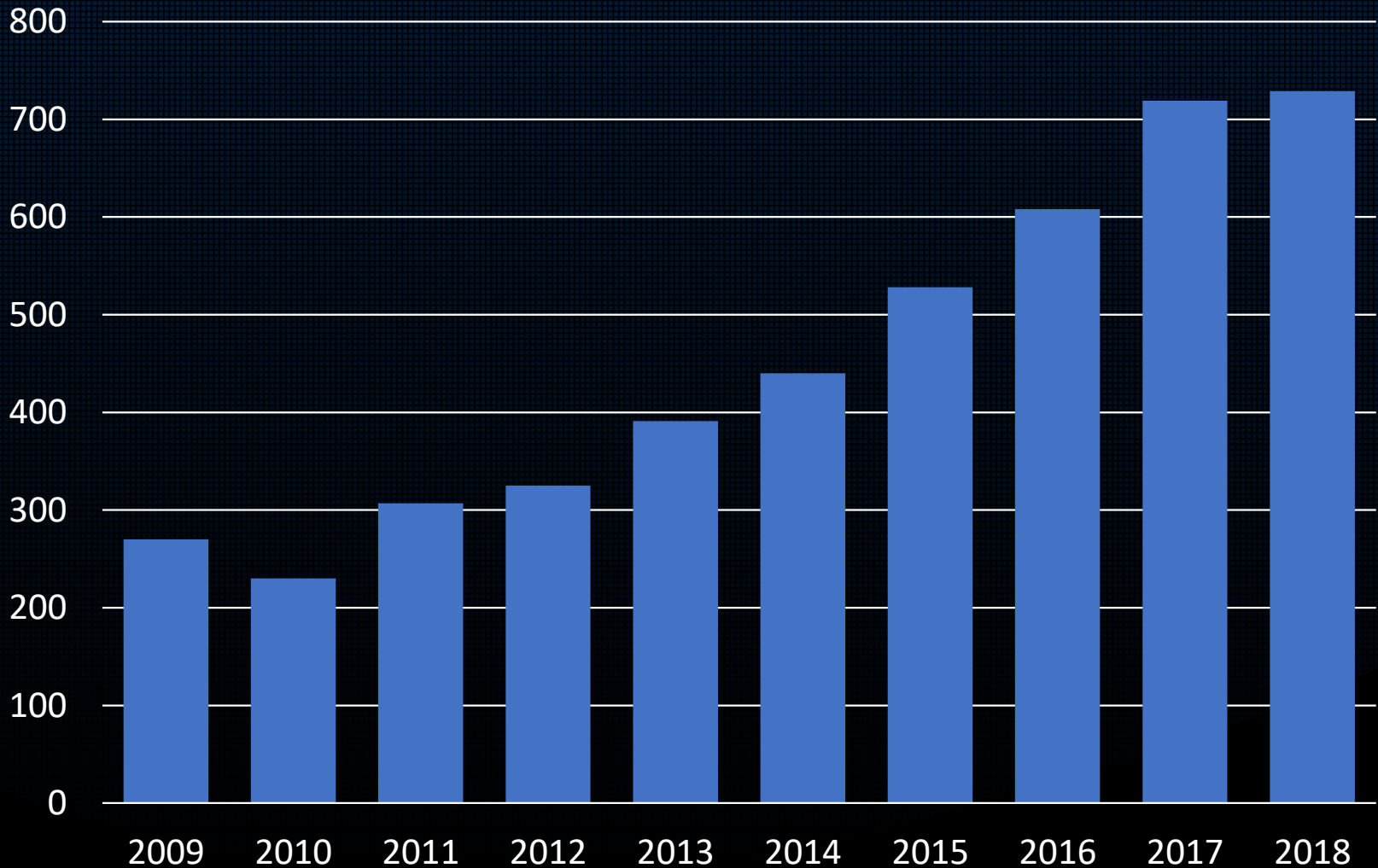
Greater Flagstaff area outlined by red circle accounts for approximately 65% of activity county wide

Detention Services

- *Around 11,000 bookings*
- *Coordinates for the adjudication process with courts*
- *Provides for medical care, substance abuse treatment, life skills training, community transition plans, culturally relevant programming, dietary needs, visitation opportunities*
- *Program examples: Exodus, Fresh-Start, Mental Health Rule 11*
