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To the Voters of the City of Flagstaff:

This information pamphlet provides you with information regarding the City of Flagstaff's Primary Election of August 4, 2020, in which voters will select two final mayoral candidates, as well as a Special Election to consider propositions proposed by the Flagstaff City Council. This election will be held in conjunction with the statewide election. You may vote prior to the election date using early voting procedures or in person on the day of the election at your polling place.

EARLY VOTING / VOTE BY MAIL OPTIONS

We want our voters to stay safe and healthy during this election season! If you have concerns about voting in person this year, please consider applying to receive your ballots by mail.

Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL): If you are a Permanent Early Voter with a party of Democratic, Libertarian, or Republican, you will automatically receive a ballot by mail approximately three weeks before the election. Voters who are on the PEVL and are not registered with a recognized political party, including those registered as Independent, must let the Recorder's Office know which ballot they want to receive. If a ballot is not specified, then one will not be mailed. You may sign up for the PEVL or make a party ballot request by visiting the Coconino County Elections website at www.coconino.az.gov/elections or by calling (928) 679-7860.

Request an Early Ballot: Voters who are not on the Permanent Early Voting List may request an early ballot to be mailed to them up until Friday, July 24, 2020. To request an early ballot, please visit the Coconino County Elections website at www.coconino.az.gov/elections or call (928) 679-7860.


I was elected to a four-year term on the Flagstaff City Council in November 2016. Before being elected to the Council, I served for three years on the City Water Commission.

PROPOSITION NO. 434

FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH UNS GAS, INC.

FRANCHISE INFORMATION

(For more information see Frequently Asked Questions below)

UNS Gas, Inc., an Arizona public service corporation, provides natural gas to most of Northern Arizona, including the City of Flagstaff, under the UniSource Energy Services brand. UNS Gas has a 25-year franchise with the City of Flagstaff dated September 9, 1995, which allows UNS Gas to use the public rights-of-way and easements in the City of Flagstaff to construct, operate, and maintain facilities for the handling, production, manufacturing, transporting, storing, sale, and distribution of natural gas. The current franchise expires in October 2020.

UNS Gas has submitted a proposed franchise to the City of Flagstaff for the purpose of supplying natural gas to the citizens of Flagstaff. The City Council has found that issuance of the franchise will benefit the community. A franchise is subject to voter approval, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes § 9-501 and the Flagstaff City Charter, Article 12, Section 1. This means a majority of the qualified voters of the City of Flagstaff must authorize the granting of a franchise before the City of Flagstaff can enter into the new agreement.

If approved, UNS Gas will be granted a new 25-year franchise to use the City's public rights-of-way to construct, operate, and maintain facilities for the handling, production, manufacturing, transporting, storing, sale, and distribution of natural gas.

Questions about Proposition 434 – Franchise Agreement with UNS Gas, Inc.

Does the franchise establish the rates that I pay for natural gas?

No. Rates are established by the Arizona Corporation Commission.

Will UNS Gas pay a franchise fee?

Yes. UNS Gas will continue to pay to the City a 2% franchise fee on gross revenues for the privilege to use the public rights-of-way for its natural gas system and passes this fee along to its customers.

Why is the franchise for 25 years?

The Arizona Constitution provides that a franchise cannot exceed 25 years. The City Council believes this is an appropriate term.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLAGSTAFF, PROPOSING A PERMANENT ADJUSTMENT TO THE 1979-80 BASE EXPENDITURE LIMITATION OF THE CITY OF FLAGSTAFF

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Constitution permits the submission to the voters of a city or town of a permanent adjustment to the base expenditure limitation;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Flagstaff has determined that a permanent base adjustment is necessary for the City of Flagstaff.

ENACTMENTS:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLAGSTAFF AS FOLLOWS:

That the following permanent base adjustment be submitted to the voters of the City of Flagstaff:

Shall the expenditure base of the City of Flagstaff be permanently adjusted by \$4,000,000.

SUMMARY ANALYSIS

Pursuant to the Arizona State Constitution, the City of Flagstaff seeks voter approval to permanently adjust the expenditure base of the City as determined by the Economic Estimates Commission. If approved by the voters, the City's 1979-80 base expenditure limitation will be increased by \$4 million adjusted each future year for population and inflation growth since 1979-80.

With voter approval, in 2021-2022 the City's expenditure limitation will increase by \$30,853,976, from \$173,730,761 to \$204,584,737. The City will utilize the additional expenditure authority for any local budgetary purposes including maintaining and enhancing quality of life programs such as water, wastewater, stormwater, police protection, fire, street maintenance and parking. Further, the additional expenditures authority will be used to expand the City's pay-as-you-go financing of capital improvements including water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure and street infrastructure. The dollar figures in this statement are estimates only.

If approved, the additional authorized expenditures will be funded from revenues obtained from local sources.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Pursuant to the Arizona State Constitution, the City of Flagstaff as authorized by Resolution #2020-10 passed on March 17, 2020 will seek voter approval to permanently adjust the expenditure base of the City as determined by the Economic Estimates Commission.

With voter approval, the City will permanently increase the 1979-80 expenditure base of the City by \$4 million beginning in fiscal year 2021-2022 and utilize the additional expenditure authority for all local budgetary purposes including maintaining and enhancing quality of life programs such as water, wastewater, stormwater, police protection, fire, street maintenance and parking. Further, the additional expenditures authority will be used to expand the City's pay-as-you-go financing of capital improvements including water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure and street infrastructure.

If approved, the additional expenditures authorized will be funded from revenue obtained from local sources. In 2021-2022, the City's expenditure limitation will increase by \$30,853,976, from \$173,730,761 to \$204,584,737. In Fiscal Year 2021-2022, \$30,853,976 will be funded through local revenue sources. The City property tax shall be limited to the amount prescribed in the Arizona State Constitution. All dollar figures in this analysis are estimates only.

In determining the revenue sources to fund the authorized additional expenditures, it is assumed that the federal, state, and local revenues received by the City will continue to be available and increase as they have for the past seven years. In the past seven years, federal revenue has increased by approximately 2.6% each year while state revenue has increased by approximately 3.2% and local revenue has increased by approximately 5.3% each year.

EXPENDITURE BASE LIMITATION INFORMATION

(For more information see Summary/Detailed Analysis above and Frequently Asked Questions below)

This ballot measure will allow the City of Flagstaff to spend revenues it collects to maintain the level of services it now provides. Its adoption will not result in an increase in City taxes.

The expenditure base is a fixed amount, originally determined in 1978. The City received previous permanent base adjustments in 1988 and 2006. The expenditure limitation is adjusted annually to account for population growth and inflation. The formula does not, however, factor in new and expanded program growth or new revenues. By approving the increase to the permanent base, the City will be allowed to continue existing and expanded services as revenues are collected.

This proposition does not raise additional money in taxes or fees, rather it enables the City to spend what revenues it collects as necessary. Normal budgeting processes and constraints will continue to apply. The City will continue to provide a balanced annual budget.

Questions about Proposition 435 – Permanent Adjustment of the City’s Expenditure Base

What is the City “expenditure limitation”?

The expenditure limitation is the maximum amount that the City may spend each year, even if it has more money available to spend. The expenditure limitation is recalculated by the State on an annual basis. For fiscal year 2020-21, the City’s expenditure limitation is \$168,625,388.

Why is there a limitation?

In 1980 Arizona voters approved an amendment to the Arizona Constitution, that set an annual expenditure limitation on all cities, counties, towns, and community college districts. The purpose of the expenditure limitation is to limit spending.

How is the expenditure limitation calculated?

The formula for calculating the expenditure limitation is found in the Arizona Constitution, Article IX, Section 20: the limitation “shall be determined by adjusting the amount of actual payments of local revenues for [the City] for fiscal year 1979-1980 to reflect the changes in the population of [the City] and the cost of living.” The City “base expenditure limitation” was \$15,122,966 in 1980. The City current base limitation is \$22,522,966. The state Economic Estimates Commission (EEC) uses the base limitation to calculate the annual expenditure limitation by evaluating changes for population and inflation, per A.R.S. § 41-563.

Why does the City of Flagstaff need to adjust the expenditure limitation?

The City has experienced growth at a rate greater than the annual expenditure limitation increases. This growth is related to the road repair and street safety improvement program (new in 2015), parking district program (new in 2017), increased expenditures related water, wastewater and stormwater, and cost increases for police and fire to name a few growth-related services and programs.

Why does the question read an increase of \$4 million but the City will receive an increase of approximately \$30.9 million?

The City is legally mandated to phrase the question in ‘1980 dollars.’ When the Economic Estimates Commission (EEC) applies the formula that has both the population and inflation factors in it, the ‘1980 dollars’ of a \$4.0 million increase are translated into the current estimated adjustment of \$30.9 million.

Are my taxes going to go up?

There is no tax increase associated with an increased expenditure limitation. The increase in the expenditure limitation gives the City the ability to budget and spend revenues that the voters have approved.

Is the City going to immediately spend all this money?

This ballot measure only increases the amount allowed to spend annually. The City will continue to operate with a balanced budget set by the City Council each year. Increasing the authority to spend as revenues are available does not allow the City to spend more than it has resources for.

What happens if the City were to exceed the expenditure limitation, without authorization?

If the City were to exceed its expenditure limitation without authorization, the State will withhold shared income tax revenues from the City as follows:

- If the City's excess expenditures are less than 5 percent of the limitation, the amount withheld is equal to the excess expenditures.
- If the excess expenditures are between 5 percent and 10 percent of the limitation or are less than 5 percent of the limitation but it is at least the second consecutive instance of excess expenditures, the amount withheld is equal to 3 times the excess expenditures.
- If the excess expenditures are equal to 10 percent or more of the limitation, the amount withheld is equal to 5 times the excess expenditures or one-third of its allocation of State income tax, whichever is less.

In case of disaster, however, that penalty would not apply.

Has the City changed its expenditure limitation in the past?

The City has been able to change its expenditure limitation in the past.

- In 1988, the City received a permanent base adjustment of \$1.9 million to allow for the expenditure of funds resulting from the addition of the 2% Bed, Board, and Beverage tax.
- In 2006, the City received a permanent base adjustment of \$5.5 million which increased the total fiscal year 2006-2007 expenditure limitation by approximately \$25 million due to a 49.8% increase in primary property tax collections, a 26.4% increase in City sales tax, a 34.1% increase in auto lieu tax, a 37.4% increase in pay-as-you go capital, and an \$8 million increase in transportation tax.
