Notes:

- 1. Residential conventional system permit requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The permit fee includes 2 reviews and on the third submittal the construction authorization will be issued or denied.
- 2. Commercial conventional system permit requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The permit fee includes 3 reviews and on the fourth submittal the construction authorization will be issued or denied.
- 3. Residential alternative system permit requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The permit fee includes 2 reviews and on the third submittal the construction authorization will be issued or denied.
- 4. Commercial alternative system permit requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The permit fee includes 3 reviews and on the fourth submittal the construction authorization will be issued or denied.
- 5. Large system permit requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The permit fee includes 5 reviews and on the sixth submittal the construction authorization will be issued or denied.
- 6. Site Investigation "permit" requires the submission of an application with required documentation. This fee includes up to 8 test holes inspected during up to 2 site visits. Results are issued as opposed to an approval or denial. The results may be used to design the onsite wastewater system, conventional or alternative, as appropriate.
- 7. Room Addition Remodel "permit" requires the submission of an application with required documentation. The review evaluates the proposed improvements to determine if the existing wastewater system is adequate. If not, then the appropriate site investigation and onsite system permits is required.
- 8. Request for Wastewater System Information (File Search) application must be completed and submitted. It will take 5 to 7 days for a response.
- 9. Transfer of Ownership application must be completed and returned with the Transfer Inspection Report.
- 10. Hauler, Water or Waste, application must be completed, submitted, and inspection scheduled.
- 11. A redesign fee applies when the applicant makes a substantial change to the original submittal. It may also be applied when the applicant fails to respond within 60 days of the Request for Additional Information (RFAI).
- 12. A repair permit is for a repair that is beyond the normal operation and maintenance functions as described in R18-9-A309(A)(9).
- 13. A lesser fee is applied to alternative systems with a disposal system that is not pressurized. The same application is used for both types of alternate systems.
- 14. This fee applies to each additional inspection or investigation review beyond the two covered by the original permit. There is no application form.
- 15. A well driller files the application and fee with a copy of the ADWR NOI to Drill. CCCD EQ reviews the application in the field and sends to ADWR.
- 16. An EQ Onsite Wastewater permit becomes void if the construction has not been completed and a request for Discharge Authorization has not been submitted within 2 years. If the owner intends to complete the project and no modifications are proposed, then they may submit a new application with the re-issue fee and without the plans and associated documents. (ADEQ rule does not allow extensions of a permit.)
- 17. The tank only permit applies to subdivisions where treatment and/or effluent disposal occurs in a community system. It also applies to replacing or upsizing a septic tank when no addition or modification of the disposal field is proposed.
- 18. This includes the submission of ADEQ GWS Form 511 "Appendix B County Approval of Subdivision to be Served by Individual On-Site Wastewater Treatment Facilities to ADEQ. It does not include the site investigation inspections themselves.
