



Recycling in Coconino County

City of Flagstaff

Appliance Collection

Appliance Collection Service is free to residential customers with 90 gallon service, but there is a fee charged to businesses. The units that are collected will be recycled. Collections must be scheduled in advance by calling 928-213-2110. The City accepts the following appliances: dishwashers, dryers, freezers, ovens, refrigerators, stoves, washers, and water heaters. Televisions accepted at Hazardous Products Center at 6770 Landfill Rd., (928) 527-9005.

Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFLs)

It is important to recycle CFLs because the bulbs contain a trace amount of mercury, and, if disposed of inappropriately, the released mercury vapor can cause environmental damage. Don't worry, though, if a CFL breaks in your home, simply open your windows, shut off any central air systems, and let the room air out for 15 minutes before you clean it up. To clean, do not use a vacuum or bare hands. Carefully sweep up as much as you can and pick up smaller pieces with tape. Wipe the area with a damp paper towel, place all trash in a sealable plastic bag, and dispose of in regular trash.

Burned out and unbroken CFLs can be dropped off at the Hazardous Product Center at Cinder Lake Landfill, Hunts Building Center, The Lite Company, HomeCo Ace Home Center, and Home Depot.

General Residential and Commercial Collection

The following materials are accepted: cardboard; paper; steel, tin, and aluminum cans; paperboard; plastics #1-7. 90-gallon containers are available for curbside pickup while larger two, four, and six cubic yard containers are available as well.

Batteries

Batteries (NOT automotive or business related) may be dropped off inside the Main City Library, 300 West Aspen Ave.

Glass Recycling

Glass must not be included with the general recycling. Glass can be dropped off at designated receptacles throughout the City of Flagstaff, including the Materials Recovery Facility at 1800 East Butler. Coconino County residents can drop off glass at the Cinder Lake Landfill.

Green and Wood Waste

All City of Flagstaff residents that have 90 gallon residential trash and recycling service are eligible to have yard waste collected as well. The collection runs through spring and summer months, and chipper trucks follow the same schedule as Bulk Trash Collection. Waste should be piled neatly parallel to the street. Larger branches and roots can be dropped off at Cinder Lake Landfill to be mulched on site.

Hazardous Materials

The City of Flagstaff website provides a table listing all hazardous materials and where they can be dropped off. The majority of common hazardous materials can be taken to the Hazardous Product Center, but refer to the link to be sure. The hazardous materials on this page include some construction/building waste such as asbestos, electrical equipment, gardening products, paints and painting products, and light bulbs. Coconino County

Coconino County provides recycling collection at its solid waste transfer stations throughout the County. Recyclable materials are accepted free of charge. Staffed facilities accept cardboard, newspaper, magazines, metal cans, small appliances, white goods, junk mail, aluminum, #1 through #7 plastics, and chip board. Glass is not accepted but can be brought to the City of Flagstaff's Cinder Lake site and the Material Recovery Facility on Butler Ave. in Flagstaff. A recycling information flyer is available at all manned facilities.

County Transfer Stations

The following transfer stations accept the recyclable goods listed above:

Mormon Lake Transfer Station (928) 679-8300

Open Sundays 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. The site has open-top waste bins, a white goods and scrap steel bin, a residential recyclables bin, and ash barrels.

Willard Springs Transfer Station (928) 286-1866

Open Friday and Saturday 9:00 am - 3:00 pm in the winter and Friday - Monday 9:00 am - 5:00 pm in the summer. The site has a waste compactor, two open-top waste bins, a recycle bin, a white goods and scrap steel bin, and ash barrels. This site also offers a fenced ½ acre forest material collection and burn area.
